The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica Year C

First Reading - 1 Ezekiel 47.1-2, 8-9, 12

A reading from the book of the prophet Ezekiel.

I saw water flowing from the temple and all to whom that water came were saved. The angel of the Lord brought me back to the entrance of the temple; there, water was flowing from below the threshold of the temple toward the east, for the temple faced east; and the water was flowing down from below the south end of the threshold of the temple, south of the altar. 2 8 9 12 Then the angel brought me out by way of the north gate, and led me around on the outside to the outer gate that faces toward the east; and the water was coming out on the south side. He said to me, "This water flows toward the eastern region and goes down into the Arabah; and when it enters the sea, the sea of stagnant waters, the water will become fresh. Wherever the river goes, every living creature that swarms will live, and there will be very many fish, once these waters reach there. It will become fresh; and everything will live where the river goes. "On the banks, on both sides of the river, there will grow all kinds of trees for food. Their leaves will not wither nor their fruit fail, but they will bear fresh fruit every month, because the water for them flows from the sanctuary. Their fruit will be for food, and their leaves for healing."

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 46.1-2, 4-5, 7-8 (R.4)

R. The waters of the river gladden the city of God.

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea. **R.**

There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved; God will help it when the morning dawns. **R.**

The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. Come, behold the works of the Lord; see what awesome things he has brought on the earth. **R.**

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 3.9b-11, 16-17

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

Brothers and sisters, you are God's building. According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building on it. Each builder must choose with care how to build on it. For no one can lay any foundation other than the one that has been laid; that foundation is Jesus Christ. Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person. For God's temple is holy, and you are that temple.

Gospel - John 2.13-22

A reading from the holy gospel according to John.

The Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and the money changers seated at their tables. Making a whip of cords, he drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. He also poured out the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. He told those who were selling the doves, "Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!" His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me." The people then said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." They then said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?" But Jesus was speaking of the temple of his body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

Updates/feedback on parish programs

- Multicultural Mass Sunday 9 November (visits from TMC and Holy Family APRIMS)
 - Lots of work on refining details, flyer and format, morning tea, accessibility and amenities
 - Lots of support to ensure a successful event
- Sacramental Program / Sacramental Coordinator
 - Christ the King group (Reconciliation, Confirmation and Holy Communion)
 - There will be ten young adults and two children that missed out on the sacraments this year because they went overseas at the time of the sacraments received in the parish.
- Christmas carols - change of date from the 7th to the 6th of December as it clashed with the regular Filipino mass on a Sunday
- Advent Workshop going ahead 23rd November – resources being prepared
- Christmas 6pm Children's Mass on 24th December – Nativity Play during the Gospel. Children will play the parts and dress up for it e.g. animals, angels, shepherds, etc. Practice in early December school holidays. Need volunteers to make costumes.
- Grace attended Training for the Joy of the Gospel 23rd September 2025. Only four parishes are piloting the Joy of the Gospel Formation Booklet and Salisbury is one of them.
 - Invite between 5 and ten people per session
 - Requirement. Hospitality, sharing reading and reflecting. Approx 90 minutes.
 - Had first session today 21st of October 9. 00 until 10.30 and then morning tea. Good feedback from 6 people who attended.
- Pilgrims of Hope: Transformed through Sacrament and Song – with participants from all over the world, was a success.
- Letter from Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide re phased reintroduction of the Chalice at Mass.
- Youth Group (Reported by Gabby) - Recent events & Plans
 - YFCA Youth camp (successful, good feedback from some attendees)
 - Events included spiritual talks, prayers, group discussions, games, singing, and food
 - Keep trying to spread the word via media newsletters, group chats, f2f
 - Keep collaborating with other youth groups in Adelaide so I can introduce these to our youth and hopefully spark some engagement.
 - Forming a youth group may take longer than expected.

NOTIZIE ITALIANE - Domenica 9 Novembre 2025

32ª Domenica - Anno C (Giovanni 2, 13-22.)

(Source: Pope Francis - Angelus 8 March 2015)

Gesù salì a Gerusalemme. Trovò nel tempio gente che vendeva buoi, pecore e colombe e, là seduti, i cambiamonete. Allora fece una frusta di cordicelle e scacciò tutti fuori del tempio, con le pecore e i buoi; gettò a terra il denaro dei cambiamonete e ne rovesciò i banchi, e ai venditori di colombe disse: «Portate via di qui queste cose e non fate della casa del Padre mio un mercato!». I suoi discepoli si ricordarono che sta scritto: «Lo zelo per la tua casa mi divorerà». Allora i Giudei presero la parola e gli dissero: «Quale segno ci mostri per fare queste cose?». Rispose loro Gesù: «Distruggete questo tempio e in tre giorni lo farò risorgere». Gli dissero allora i Giudei: «Questo tempio è stato costruito in quarantasei anni e tu in tre giorni lo farai risorgere?». Ma egli parlava del tempio del suo corpo. Quando poi fu risuscitato dai morti, i suoi discepoli si ricordarono che aveva detto questo, e credettero alla Scrittura e alla parola detta da Gesù. Parola del Signore

Gesù «fece una frusta di cordicelle e scacciò tutti fuori del tempio, con le pecore e i buoi», il denaro, tutto. Tale gesto suscitò forte impressione, nella gente e nei discepoli. Chiaramente apparve come un gesto profetico, tanto che alcuni dei presenti domandarono a Gesù: «Quale segno ci mostri per fare queste cose?», chi sei tu per fare queste cose? Mostraci un segno che tu hai autorità per farle. Cercavano un segno divino, prodigioso che accreditasse Gesù come inviato da Dio. Ed Egli rispose: «Distruggete questo tempio e in tre giorni lo farò risorgere». Abbiamo qui, secondo l'evangelista Giovanni, il primo annuncio della morte e risurrezione di Cristo: il suo corpo, distrutto sulla croce dalla violenza del peccato, diventerà nella Risurrezione il luogo dell'appuntamento universale tra Dio e gli uomini.
