RECONCILIATION

14th September 2025 The Exaltation of the Holy Cross - Year C 'Safeguarding Sunday'

First Reading - Numbers 21.4-9

A reading from the book of Numbers

The Israelites set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but they became impatient on the way. The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 78.1-2, 34-35, 36-37, 38 (R.7b)

R. Do not forget the works of the Lord!

Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old. R.

When God killed them, the people sought for him; they repented and sought him earnestly. They remembered that God was their rock, the Most High God their redeemer. R.

But they flattered him with their mouths; they lied to him with their tongues. Their heart was not steadfast toward him; they were not true to his covenant. R.

Yet he, being compassionate, forgave their iniquity, and did not destroy them; often he restrained his anger, and did not stir up all his wrath. R.

Second Reading - Philippians 2.6-11

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Philippians

Christ humbled himself, therefore God also highly exalted him. A reading from the letter of Paul to the Philippians. Though Christ Jesus was in the form of God, he did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, 8 he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death— even death on a cross. Therefore God highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Gospel - John 3.13-17

A reading from the holy gospel according to John

"No one has ascended into heaven except the one who Jesus said to Nicodemus: descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

GOSPEL REFLECTION - John 3.13-17

What other religion would have as its central symbol two rough hewn planks of wood fashioned into an instrument of torture on which our Founder, Jesus of Nazareth, was cruelly done to death? And yet, today, we speak of 'The Triumph of the Cross'. Where is the triumph? Let us rid ourselves of one terrible answer: that our heavenly Father willed that Jesus Christ should suffer that tortured death. What sort of cruel despot would I be called on to worship if that were the case? What his Heavenly Father willed was that Jesus Christ should remain steadfast in the face of adversity, should remain true to his mission to teach and embody the mercy, the forgiveness, the all-inclusive love of God for every human being. When Jesus persevered (not my will but thine be done), the Cross was the inevitable result. Death appeared to have won the battle to ensure a death dominated world. But three days later, our Lord appeared to St Thomas bearing the marks of the wounds of the Cross but now indelibly imprinted on his resurrection body. That is victory, that is triumph. A victory and a triumph in which we are all called to share.

Dio infatti ha tanto amato il mondo da dare il Figlio unigenito, perché chiunque crede in lui non vada perduto, ma abbia la vita eterna. Dio, infatti, non ha mandato il Figlio nel mondo per condannare il mondo, ma perché il mondo sia salvato per mezzo di lui». Parola del Signore «Come Mosè innalzò il serpente nel deserto, così bisogna che sia innalzato il Figlio dell'uomo, perché chiunque crede in lui abbia la vita eterna». Ecco la svolta: è arrivato tra noi il serpente che salva: Gesù che, elevato sull'asta della croce, non permette ai serpenti velenosi che ci assalgono di condurci alla morte. Di fronte alle nostre bassezze, Dio ci dona un'altezza nuova: se teniamo lo sguardo rivolto a Gesù, i morsi del male non possono più dominarci, perché Lui, sulla croce, ha preso su di sé il veleno del peccato e della morte e ne ha sconfitto la potenza distruttiva. Fratelli e sorelle, questa è la strada, la strada della nostra salvezza, della nostra rinascita e risurrezione: guardare a Gesù crocifisso. Le braccia allargate di Gesù sono l'abbraccio di tenerezza con cui Dio vuole accoglierci. E ci mostrano la fraternità che siamo chiamati a vivere tra di noi e con tutti. Ci indicano la via, la via cristiana: non quella dell'imposizione e della costrizione, della potenza e della rilevanza, mai quella che impugna la croce di Cristo contro altri fratelli e sorelle per i quali Egli ha dato la vita! È un'altra la via di Gesù, la via della salvezza: è la via dell'amore umile, gratuito e universale, senza "se" e senza "ma".
