- 2. Discussion on the execution of the building/construction phase of the priests' relocation project. Application to Build Property received approval from the PPC. Property Team liaised with Council to get the necessary approvals. Official announcement will be made at all parish Mass centres this weekend.
- 3. Presentation on the initiative, House of Refuge (HR), an idea to support families or individuals facing unplanned pregnancy by Antonio and Haydi Rangel. The idea is advertising Salisbury Parish as a House of Refuge, a place of safety and acceptance for anyone dealing with unplanned/crisis pregnancy or who have had an abortion. It is also developing mentors whose roles are to be a friend, non-judgmental support, and a listening ear. As Fr Charles was not at the meeting, PPC requested Haydi and Antonio to send written information about HR for further discussion at the PPC. Thanked Haydi and Antonio for their time.
 - Haydi and Antonio Rangel sent written information about House of Refuge (HR) for further discussion at the PPC next year. Offhand, Vicar General confirmed Archdiocesan support to this initiative pending formal statement to be issued by the Archdiocese.
- 4. Feedback re Multicultural Mass on Sunday 9th of November 930 am all 3 schools were involved and also brought together parishioners from 3 Mass centres. Strong support from the multicultural community e.g. Burmese. Win Simons and team did a good job preparing the morning tea venue. Areas for improvement include no choir music, people missed their coffee and tea due to venue restrictions, gym was too big and open, consider Family Centre as venue that allows people to mingle

- a. Updates on Parish Stewardship Renewal 2025 (Joe Abdilla) Joe Abdilla sent an interim report:
 - a. 1st component parish census, making connections process in all churches and masses produced 571 connection cards, 174 new families added plus 27 new families identified via commitment cards, total of 201 new families added. Currently, 923 families/households are active in some way.
 - b. 2nd component ministry in service, 162 existing ministries and possibly more, 38 new positions of ministry created, aim to bring these people together for formation, generally positive outcome
 - c. Final component pastoral funding, 442 contributors vs. 350 previous level, 100 new contributors, 40% increase

Joe thanked PPC members in supporting the renewal program. Fr Charles thanked Joe for a job well done. Thank you Joe!
