15th February 2026 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A *'Project Compassion Sunday'*

First Reading: Sirach 15:15-20

A reading from the book of Sirach.

If you choose, you can keep the commandments, and to act faithfully is a matter of your own choice. The Lord has placed before you fire and water; stretch out your hand for whichever you choose. Before each person are life and death, and whichever we choose will be given. For great is the wisdom of the Lord; he is mighty in power and sees everything; his eyes are on those who fear him, and he knows every human action. He has not commanded anyone to be wicked, and he has not given anyone permission to sin.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 119:1-2, 4-5, 17-18, 33-34 (R.1)

R. Happy are they who follow the law of the Lord!

Happy are those whose way is blameless, who walk in the law of the Lord. Happy are those who keep his decrees, who seek him with their whole heart. **R.**

You have commanded your precepts to be kept diligently. O that my ways may be steadfast in keeping your statutes! **R.**

Deal bountifully with your servant, so that I may live and observe your word. Open my eyes, so that I may behold wondrous things out of your law. **R.**

Teach me, O Lord, the way of your statutes, and I will observe it to the end. Give me understanding, that I may keep your law and observe it with my whole heart. **R.**

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

We speak God's wisdom, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians. My brothers and sisters, among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. As it is written, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived what God has prepared for those who love him." These things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17, 20-24, 27-28, 33-34, 37

On the mountain, Jesus gathered his disciples around him and he taught them, saying: "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfil. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. "You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, 'You shall not murder'; and 'whoever murders shall be liable to judgment.' But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, you will be liable to judgment; and if you insult a brother or sister, you will be liable to the council; and if you say, 'You fool,' you will be liable to the hell of fire. "So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift. "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart. "Again, you have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, 'You shall not swear falsely, but carry out the vows you have made to the Lord.' But I say to you: Do not swear at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, Let your word be 'Yes,' if 'Yes' or 'No,' if 'No'; anything more than this comes from the evil one."

GOSPEL REFLECTION - Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

We have just heard the least observed command of Our Lord in the Sermon on the Mount. Referring to oaths he taught, 'Do not swear at all ... instead let your "yes" mean yes and your "no" mean no. Whatever goes beyond these simple words is from the Evil One.' This is strong language. Why does Our Lord say this? In the same Sermon on the Mount, he teaches us the proper use of God's name: 'Our Father'. It is our privilege as adopted children of God to *use* God's name in that way. The use of God's name for oath-swearing is an *abuse*. Our Lord was trying to establish a new sort of society (The Kingdom) within which truth-telling was of paramount importance, where there is no two-tiered way of speaking the truth. Truth telling should issue simply from the character of the person – the truthful person truths. We know this at the very private level of intimate relationships. As a Church, we need to heed this passage and listen to the epistle of St James recalling this passage almost verbatim. (*James 5:12-13*) We could pause for a moment to pray that the Church herself heeds the Great Commission: 'Teach them to keep *all* that I have commanded you.' NOTIZIE ITALIANE - Domenica 15 Febbraio 2026

Dal Vangelo secondo Matteo - Mt 5,17-37

In verità io vi dico: finché non siano passati il cielo e la terra, non passerà un solo iota o un solo trattino della Legge, senza che tutto sia avvenuto. Chi dunque trasgredirà uno solo di questi minimi precetti e insegnerà agli altri a fare altrettanto, sarà considerato minimo nel regno dei cieli. Chi invece li osserverà e li insegnerà, sarà considerato grande nel regno dei cieli. Io vi dico infatti: se la vostra giustizia non supererà quella degli scribi e dei farisei, non entrerete nel regno dei cieli. Avete inteso che fu detto agli antichi: "Non ucciderai; chi avrà ucciso dovrà essere sottoposto al giudizio". Ma io vi dico: chiunque si adira con il proprio fratello dovrà essere sottoposto al giudizio. Chi poi dice al fratello: "Stupido", dovrà essere sottoposto al sinedrio; e chi gli dice: "Pazzo", sarà destinato al fuoco della Geënnà. Se dunque tu presenti la tua offerta all'altare e lì ti ricordi che tuo fratello ha qualche cosa contro di te, lascia lì il tuo dono davanti all'altare, va' prima a riconciliarti con il tuo fratello e poi torna a offrire il tuo dono. Parola del Signore. Gesù lo spiega mediante una serie di antitesi tra i comandamenti antichi e il suo modo di riproporli. Ogni volta inizia: "Avete inteso che fu detto agli antichi...", e poi afferma: "Ma io vi dico. E così per sei volte. Questo modo di parlare suscitava grande impressione nella gente, che rimaneva spaventata, perché quell' "io vi dico" equivaleva a rivendicare per sé la stessa autorità di Dio, fonte della Legge. La novità di Gesù consiste, essenzialmente, nel fatto che Lui stesso "riempie" i comandamenti con l'amore di Dio, con la forza dello Spirito Santo che abita in Lui. E noi, attraverso la fede in Cristo, possiamo aprirci all'azione dello Spirito Santo, che ci rende capaci di vivere l'amore divino. Perciò ogni precetto diventa vero come esigenza d'amore, e tutti si ricongiungono in un unico comandamento: ama Dio con tutto il cuore e ama il prossimo come te stesso».
