First Reading – Proverbs 8:22-31

Thus, says the wisdom of God: "The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. "Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth— when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. "When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race."

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

Gospel Reading – John 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples: "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason, I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you."

GOSPEL REFLECTION John 16.12-15 (Most Holy Trinity – Year C)

Painting the Picture of God

The Feast of the Trinity of God comes about because Jesus painted a picture of the most intimate communion of Divine Life between Himself, the Father, and the Holy Spirit. This is a relationship and yet the most perfect unity.

God is Divine pulsating, shimmering light dancing in threefold exchange of love. In fact, the best name for God is 'Being-in-Love'. What does this mean for us?

How often have you heard: 'You are made in the image and likeness of God'? If God is threefold Being-in-Love, then you and I are made to live in relationship – not in solitary. We are totally on the wrong track if we think that the ultimate good is to be self-sufficient. It will turn out to be a Hellish choice. When we live as much self-giving as is possible, we are closest to Divine Life. In fact, we are Divine Life pulsating into a particular time and place through us.

Each time we bless ourselves, a bit of a Catholic routine, we are invoking the threefold exchange of love and calling its power into our life. Be careful, there will be consequence! You could become more God-like!

We could pause for a moment, slowly make the Sign of the Cross which recalls our baptism: 'In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit', and promise to image that Name in our lives.

Visit of Relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis

From June 20-22, Salisbury Parish will host the exhibit of a first-class relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis in the Family Centre, 23 Commercial Road, Salisbury. Blessed Carlo can be considered the first millennial saint and will be canonised at a later date, by our new Pope Leo XIV. The relic exhibition will be on display in the Family Centre until 5.30pm each day. There will be a Mass in St Augustine's Church at 9.30am both on Friday, June 20, and on Saturday, June 21, followed by adoration, and confession on request. On Sunday, June 22, after the 9:00am Mass, parishioners will still have the opportunity to view the exhibition and venerate the relic until 5.30 pm.

This is part of a Vatican International Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles which Blessed Carlo put together between the ages of 11 and 15.

Domenica 15 Giugno 2025 – SS Trinità - (Giovanni 16, 12-15.)

"Tutto quello che il Padre possiede è mio; Lo Spirito prenderà del mio e ve lo annuncerà". In quel tempo, Gesù disse ai suoi discepoli: «Molte cose ho ancora da dirvi, ma per il momento non siete capaci di portarne il peso. Quando verrà lui, lo Spirito della verità, vi guiderà a tutta la verità, perché non parlerà da se stesso, ma dirà tutto ciò che avrà udito e vi annuncerà le cose future. Egli mi glorificherà, perché prenderà da quel che è mio e ve lo annuncerà. Tutto quello che il Padre possiede è mio; per questo ho detto che prenderà da quel che è mio e ve lo annuncerà». Parola del Signore.

L'odierna domenica della Santissima Trinità, in un certo senso, ricapitola la rivelazione di Dio avvenuta nei misteri pasquali: morte e risurrezione di Cristo, sua ascensione alla destra del Padre ed effusione della Spirito Santo. La mente e il linguaggio umani sono inadeguati a spiegare la relazione esistente tra il Padre, il Figlio e lo Spirito Santo, e tuttavia i Padri della Chiesa hanno cercato di illustrare il mistero di Dio Uno e Trino vivendolo nella propria esistenza con profonda fede. La Trinità divina, infatti, prende dimora in noi nel giorno del Battesimo: "Io ti battezzo - dice il ministro - nel nome del Padre e del Figlio e dello Spirito Santo". Il nome di Dio, nel quale siamo stati battezzati, noi lo ricordiamo ogni volta che tracciamo su noi stessi il segno della croce. Il teologo Romano Guardini, a proposito del segno della croce, osserva: "Lo facciamo prima della preghiera, affinché ci metta spiritualmente in ordine; concentri in Dio pensieri, cuore e volere; dopo la preghiera, affinché rimanga in noi quello che Dio ci ha donato. Esso abbraccia tutto l'essere, corpo e anima, e tutto diviene consacrato nel nome del Dio uno e trino". Nel segno della croce e nel nome del Dio vivente è, perciò, contenuto l'annuncio che genera la fede e ispira la preghiera. E, come nel vangelo Gesù promette agli Apostoli che "quando verrà lui, lo Spirito della verità, vi guiderà a tutta la verità", così avviene nella liturgia domenicale, quando i sacerdoti dispensano, di settimana in settimana, il pane della Parola e dell'Eucaristia. Invocando la Beata Vergine Maria, prima creatura pienamente inabitata dalla Santissima Trinità, domandiamo la sua protezione per proseguire bene il nostro pellegrinaggio terreno.
