First Reading - Malachi 4.1-2

A reading from the book of the prophet Malachi

The Lord says this: "See, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble; the day that comes shall burn them up," says the Lord of hosts, "so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. "But for you who revere my name the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings."

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 98.5-6, 7-8, 9 (R.9)

R. The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice.

Sing praises to the Lord with the lyre, with the lyre and the sound of melody. With trumpets and the sound of the horn make a joyful noise before the King, the Lord. **R.**

Let the sea roar, and all that fills it; the world and those who live in it. Let the floods clap their hands; let the hills sing together for joy at the presence of the Lord. **R.**

For the Lord is coming, coming to judge the earth. He will judge the world with righteousness, and the peoples with equity. **R.**

Second Reading - 2 Thessalonians 3.7-12

A reading from the second letter of Paul to the Thessalonians.

Brothers and sisters, you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labour we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: "Anyone unwilling to work should not eat." For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living.

Gospel - Luke 21.5-19

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke.

When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, Jesus said, "As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down." They asked him, "Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?" And Jesus said, "Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and, 'The time is near!' Do not go after them. "When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately." Then Jesus said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven. "But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. "This will give you an opportunity to testify. So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. "You will be betrayed even by parents, by brothers and sisters, and by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls."

GOSPEL REFLECTION - Luke 21.5-19

Our prayer can tell us a lot about the image of God we really have – holding a parking spot for us, or stopping rain on the second day of the Australian Open. But, if you were in Syria, your prayerful image of God would be as a Liberator from warfare, of a Saviour from Crimes against Humanity, of a Strengthened in time of torture and impending death. In today's Gospel, Jesus promises his persecuted followers of every age, 'Your endurance will win your lives'. As Malachi prophesied: 'the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays'. It is our faith that, out of the darkness of the tomb, the Son of righteousness did rise with healing in His rays, bathing the world with that light which makes the world habitable for human beings. We could take a moment to pray for contemporary persecuted Christians that their faithful endurance will win their lives.

NOTIZIE ITALIANE - Domenica 9 Novembre 2025

32ª Domenica - Anno C (Giovanni 2, 13-22.)

(Source: Pope Francis - Angelus 8 March 2015)

Gesù salì a Gerusalemme. Trovò nel tempio gente che vendeva buoi, pecore e colombe e, là seduti, i cambiamonete. Allora fece una frusta di cordicelle e scacciò tutti fuori del tempio, con le pecore e i buoi; gettò a terra il denaro dei cambiamonete e ne rovesciò i banchi, e ai venditori di colombe disse: «Portate via di qui queste cose e non fate della casa del Padre mio un mercato!». I suoi discepoli si ricordarono che sta scritto: «Lo zelo per la tua casa mi divorerà». Allora i Giudei presero la parola e gli dissero: «Quale segno ci mostri per fare queste cose?». Rispose loro Gesù: «Distruggete questo tempio e in tre giorni lo farò risorgere». Gli dissero allora i Giudei: «Questo tempio è stato costruito in quarantasei anni e tu in tre giorni lo farai risorgere?». Ma egli parlava del tempio del suo corpo. Quando poi fu risuscitato dai morti, i suoi discepoli si ricordarono che aveva detto questo, e credettero alla Scrittura e alla parola detta da Gesù.

Parola del Signore

Gesù «fece una frusta di cordicelle e scacciò tutti fuori del tempio, con le pecore e i buoi», il denaro, tutto. Tale gesto suscitò forte impressione, nella gente e nei discepoli. Chiaramente apparve come un gesto profetico, tanto che alcuni dei presenti domandarono a Gesù: «Quale segno ci mostri per fare queste cose?», chi sei tu per fare queste cose? Mostraci un segno che tu hai autorità per farle. Cercavano un segno divino, prodigioso che accreditasse Gesù come inviato da Dio. Ed Egli rispose: «Distruggete questo tempio e in tre giorni lo farò risorgere». Abbiamo qui, secondo l'evangelista Giovanni, il primo annuncio della morte e risurrezione di Cristo: il suo corpo, distrutto sulla croce dalla violenza del peccato, diventerà nella Risurrezione il luogo dell'appuntamento universale tra Dio e gli uomini.
