Solemnity of The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ - Year C

First Reading – Genesis 14: 18-20

A reading from the book of Genesis.

When Abram heard that his nephew, Lot, had been taken captive, he led forth his trained men, and routed the abductors. After Abram's return King Melchizedek of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was priest of God Most High. He blessed Abram and said, "Blessed be Abram by God Most High, maker of heaven and earth; and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand!" And Abram gave him one tenth of everything.

Responsorial Psalm – Psalm 110.1, 2, 3, 4, (R.4)

R. You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek.

1. The Lord says to my lord, "Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies your footstool. **R.**
2. The Lord sends out from Zion your mighty sceptre. Rule in the midst of your foes. **R.**
3. Your people will offer themselves willingly on the day you lead your forces on the holy mountains. From the womb of the morning, like dew, your youth will come to you. **R.**
4. The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind, "You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek. **R.**

Second Reading – 1 Corinthians 11: 23-26

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

Beloved, I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Gospel Reading – Luke 9: 11b-17

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke.

Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God and healed those who needed to be cured. The day was drawing to a close, and the twelve came to him and said, "Send the crowd away, so that they may go into the surrounding villages and countryside, to lodge and get provisions; for we are here in a deserted place." But Jesus said to them, "You give them something to eat." They said, "We have no more than five loaves and two fish— unless we are to go and buy food for all these people." For there were about five thousand men. And Jesus said to his disciples, "Make the people sit down in groups of about fifty each." They did so and made them all sit down. And taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. And all ate and were filled. What was left over was gathered up, twelve baskets of broken pieces.

GOSPEL REFLECTION *Luke 9: 11b-17 (Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ – Year C)*

Tasting the Future

The feeding of the five thousand in today's Gospel is one of those anticipatory sharings in the heavenly banquet of the age to come.

We say this feeding is miraculous, and it was. A major part of the miracle is in the transformation of the Twelve. Our Lord did not personally feed the five thousand. He required his followers to get involved in alleviating hunger: 'You give them something to eat,' rather than leaving the crowd to fend for themselves, or resort to market economics. When they shared the food he had blessed, the miracle of the hospitality of God was multiplied throughout the crowd – extravagantly.

And so, our Lord gave his followers and the crowd a real taste of the future generosity of God in the heavenly banquet. But, it would not have happened had the inner groups of disciples not shared Jesus' vision and got involved in what seemed to be an impossible task.

The Last Supper was the greatest anticipatory meal which Our Lord shared with his disciples. And, at Mass, we are eating and drinking the *glorified* humanity of our *Risen* Lord Jesus Christ: the life of the future.

We could pause for a moment to identify the myriad of hungers in this world and resolve to fulfil Our Lord's Command: 'You give them something to eat!' so that Divine Generosity might transform human history.

From June 20-22, Salisbury Parish will host the exhibit of a first-class relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis in the Family Centre, 23 Commercial Road, Salisbury. Blessed Carlo can be considered the first millennial saint and will be canonised at a later date, by our new Pope Leo XIV. The relic exhibition will be on display in the Family Centre until 5.30pm each day. There will be a Mass in St Augustine's Church at 9.30am both on Friday, June 20, and on Saturday, June 21, followed by adoration, and confession on request. On Sunday, June 22, after the 9:00am Mass, parishioners will still have the opportunity to view the exhibition and venerate the relic until 5.30 pm.

This is part of a Vatican International Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles which Blessed Carlo put together between the ages of 11 and 15.

NOTIZIE ITALIANE

Domenica 22 Giugno 2025 – Corpus Domini - (Luca 9, 11b-17.)

(Source: Homilies by Pope Francis)

Gesù prese a parlare alle folle del regno di Dio e a guarire quanti avevano bisogno di cure. Il giorno cominciava a declinare e i Dodici gli si avvicinarono dicendo: «Congeda la folla perché vada nei villaggi e nelle campagne dei dintorni, per alloggiare e trovare cibo: qui siamo in una zona deserta». Gesù disse loro: «Voi stessi date loro da mangiare». Ma essi risposero: «Non abbiamo che cinque pani e due pesci, a meno che non andiamo noi a comprare viveri per tutta questa gente». C'erano infatti circa cinquemila uomini. Egli disse ai suoi discepoli: «Fateli sedere a gruppi di cinquanta circa». Fecero così e li fecero sedere tutti quanti. Egli prese i cinque pani e i due pesci, alzò gli occhi al cielo, recitò su di essi la benedizione, li spezzò e li dava ai discepoli perché li distribuissero alla folla. Tutti mangiarono a sazietà e furono portati via i pezzi loro avanzati: dodici ceste. Parola del Signore.

L'Eucaristia, istituita nell'Ultima Cena, fu come il punto di arrivo di un percorso, lungo il quale Gesù l'aveva prefigurata mediante alcuni segni, soprattutto la moltiplicazione dei pani, raccontata nel Vangelo della Liturgia odierna. Gesù si prende cura della grande folla che lo ha seguito per ascoltare la sua parola ed essere liberata da vari mali. Benedice cinque pani e due pesci, li spezza, i discepoli distribuiscono, e «tutti mangiarono a sazietà», dice il Vangelo. Nell'Eucaristia ognuno può fare esperienza di questa amorosa e concreta attenzione del Signore. Chi riceve con fede il Corpo e il Sangue di Cristo non solo mangia, ma viene saziato. Mangiare ed essere saziati: si tratta di due fondamentali necessità, che nell'Eucaristia vengono appagate.

Mangiare. «Tutti mangiarono», scrive San Luca. Sul far della sera i discepoli consigliano a Gesù di congedare la folla, perché possa andare a cercare il cibo. Ma il Maestro vuole provvedere anche a questo: a chi lo ha ascoltato vuole dare pure da mangiare. Il miracolo dei pani e dei pesci non avviene però in maniera spettacolare, ma quasi riservatamente, come alle nozze di Cana: il pane aumenta passando di mano in mano. E mentre mangia, la folla si rende conto che Gesù si prende cura di tutto. Questo è il Signore presente nell'Eucaristia: ci chiama ad essere cittadini del Cielo, ma intanto tiene conto del cammino che dobbiamo affrontare qui in terra. Se ho poco pane nella borsa, Lui lo sa e se ne preoccupa.
