23rd November 2025 Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe - Year C 'World Youth Day '

First Reading - 2 Samuel 5.1-3

A reading from the second book of Samuel.

All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron, and said, "Look, we are your bone and flesh. For some time, while Saul was king over us, it was you who led out Israel and brought it in. The Lord said to you: 'It is you who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you who shall be ruler over Israel." So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron; and King David made a covenant with them at Hebron before the Lord, and they anointed David king over Israel.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 122.1-2, 3-4a, 4b-5, 6-7, 8-9 (R.1)

R. Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the Lord!" Our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem. R.

Jerusalem—built as a city that is bound firmly together. To it the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord. R.

As it was decreed for Israel, to give thanks to the name of the Lord. For there the thrones for judgment were set up, the thrones of the house of David. R.

Second Reading - Colossians 1.12-20

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Colossians.

Give thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. The Father has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. Christ is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers— all things have been created through him and for him. Christ is before all things, and in him all things hold together. Christ is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in Christ all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

Gospel - Luke 23.35-43

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke.

When Jesus had been crucified, the people stood by watching; the leaders scoffed at him saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked Jesus, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over Jesus, "This is the King of the Jews." One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding Jesus and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

GOSPEL REFLECTION - Luke 23.35-43

If you memorise a tune or your 'times tables', you are said to 'know it by heart'. The sort of person who will always remember me is someone who 'knows me by heart'. Here, a tortured criminal starts his plea: 'Jesus . . . '. This is one of only two instances where Jesus is addressed by his name which means 'The Lord saves'. The good thief went on: 'remember me when you come into Your Kingdom'. Jesus 'knows him by heart' and promises that He will re-member him in Paradise. This is an exercise of sovereignty which befits 'Christ the King'. This is all the Kingly power which you or I will ever need, but to confidently invoke it we need to position ourselves alongside Jesus, like the 'good thief'. We do this by our practical concern for the poor and by coming to Mass which re-members the Body of Christ. We could pause for a moment to pray: 'Jesus, remember me, know me by heart, for when you do I will be in Paradise.'

NOTIZIE ITALIANE - Domenica 23 Novembre 2025 34ª Domenica - Anno C (Luca 23, 35-43.)

(Source: Pope Francis - Homily 20 November 2022)

In quel tempo, dopo che ebbero crocifisso Gesù, il popolo stava a vedere; i capi invece deridevano Gesù dicendo: «Ha salvato altri! Salvi se stesso, se è lui il Cristo di Dio, l'eletto». Anche i soldati lo deridevano, gli si accostavano per porgergli dell'aceto e dicevano: «Se tu sei il re dei Giudei, salva te stesso». Sopra di lui c'era anche una scritta: «Costui è il re dei Giudei». Uno dei malfattori appesi alla croce lo insultava: «Non sei tu il Cristo? Salva te stesso e noi!». L'altro invece lo rimproverava dicendo: «Non hai alcun timore di Dio, tu che sei condannato alla stessa pena? Noi, giustamente, perché riceviamo quello che abbiamo meritato per le nostre azioni; egli invece non ha fatto nulla di male». E disse: «Gesù, ricordati di me quando entrerai nel tuo regno». Gli rispose: «In verità io ti dico: oggi con me sarai nel paradiso».

Parola del Signore

Sulla croce appare una sola frase: «Costui è il re dei Giudei». Ecco il titolo: Re. Egli non è seduto su un comodo trono, ma appeso ad un patibolo; il Dio che «rovescia i potenti dai troni» opera come servo messo in croce dai potenti; ornato solo di chiodi e di spine, spogliato di tutto ma ricco di amore, dal trono della croce non ammaestra più le folle con la parola, non alza più la mano per insegnare. Fa di più: non punta il dito contro nessuno, ma apre le braccia a tutti. Così si manifesta il nostro Re: a braccia aperte. Solo entrando nel suo abbraccio noi capiamo: capiamo che Dio si è spinto fino a lì, fino al paradosso della croce, proprio per abbracciare tutto di noi, anche quanto di più distante c'era da Lui: la nostra morte. Lui ha abbracciato la nostra morte, il nostro dolore, le nostre povertà, le nostre fragilità e le nostre miserie. E Lui ha abbracciato tutto questo. Si è fatto servo perché ciascuno di noi si senta figlio.
